## Guidance for enrolment of Sangha Membership

**1. Eligibility for membership:** Only those adult persons (about 24 years and above) irrespective of colour, creed or caste may apply for membership of the Sangha who have religious inclinations and deep respect for Ma and **who have taken diksha from the Acharyas of Shree Shree Anandamayee Sangha**. Besides, they are really willing to provide some services (physical/financial) to the Sangha and agree to abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Sangha. They should not have any criminal background.

**2. Procedure to apply for becoming a member:** The fresh applicants are requested to submit their applications in the newly revised prescribed form to be obtained from the Head Office or from the Branch ashrams. Furnish all the desired information in the prescribed form specifically name of the Acharya from whom he or she received Diksha and in which year and at which place. The applicant will submit the filled up form to the Secretary of their nearby Ma's ashram who will after scrutiny will recommend and forward to Swami Shivananda at the Head Office for getting them scrutinized further and he will put up in the meeting of the Executive Council for approval. The processing may take some time.

**3. Fees to be donated for Membership:** The applicants will donate the revised prescribed fees to the General Secretary at Kankhal, Haridwar within a

fortnight after receiving intimation from the Head Office about approval of their applications. Payment made through Bank Cheques should be payable to “Shree Shree Anandamayee Sangha”.

i. **Ordinary Membership: subscription of Rs. 600/-** annually. It should be paid annually within 3 months after the due date i.e., by 30<sup>th</sup> June every year positively; otherwise membership will be treated as defaulted/invalid.

ii. **Life Membership Fee (Individual).....Rs. 5000/-**

iii **Life Membership Fee (Husband & wife).....Rs. 6000/-**

#### **4. Allotment of Membership Number:**

The applicants who have donated the prescribed fees at the Head Office in Kankhal, Haridwar, their membership number will be informed there after which may be treated as final. Name of new life members will be published in the annual report every year.

#### **5. Conversion of an Ordinary Member to Life Member:**

An ordinary member desiring to become a life member should apply in the aforesaid prescribed application form. After receiving approval from the Head Office he should deposit the prescribed fee to become a life member and he will receive membership number thereafter.

6. On expiry of any Sangha member, the family members must inform at the Head office mentioning his membership number allotted to him/her.

#### **Guidance for the persons seeking Deeksha (Initiation)**

**Eligibility for Deeksha:** Only those devotees, irrespective of colour, creed or caste, who have religious inclinations and deep love and respect for Shree Shree Anandamayee Ma's life and Vani, and a strong aspiration to gain Deeksha from Shree Shree Anandamayee Sangha may avail Deeksha from the Sangha Acharyas.

**Mantra Diksha: Acharya Swami Biswanathanand Maharaj** has been designated by the Sangha to give Mantra Deeksha, Naistika Brahmacharya Deeksha and Sannyas Deeksha to the aspirants as an Acharya but not as a Guru.

#### **Pre conditions for Deeksharthis for Deeksha**

1. The aspirant will be provided with a booklet containing the details of the Deeksha Leela of Shree Shree Ma and life and teaching of Shree Ma. Aspirants have to go through them thoroughly.

2. Aspirant will be asked to write the name of their favoured deity ((Ista Devata) without adding any syllable or, word either as a prefix or suffix at least 10,000 times in a notebook. Aspirants have to come and meet the Acharya at least one day prior to Deeksha date and have to submit the 'NAM note book' failing which he/she will be denied of taking Deeksha.

3. Aspirants below the age of 11 are eligible for Nam Deeksha only. For Nam Diksha there is no necessity for any obligatory rites and rituals,

before or after Deeksha.

4. After Deeksha each aspirant will be provided with a printed procedure of doing Sandhya Vandan which should be the lifelong commitment of the aspirant.

**Place of Deeksha:** Deeksha ceremony can be held only in any of Ma's ashrams as per convenience of the Acharya.

**Life to be chosen after Deeksha:** Deeksha is not merely the gift of a mantra or a sacred symbol; it is a profound spiritual ceremony that can transform one's entire life. DEEKSHA is INITIATION means starting to walk on the road leading to Divinity and Self Realisation. Therefore he has to do Sandhya Vandan Japa and Swadhyay daily as a fixed routine.

One should try to lead a religious life with truthfulness, simple living and avoid any sort of intoxication. If one sincerely and regularly does Japa of the Beej mantra, such a pure life gradually manifests without much effort.

As Pujya Swami Achyutananda Maharaj, who has been imparting Sannyas and Naistika Brahmacharya Deeksha Mantras as an Acharya (not as a Guru), is currently unwell and bedridden, the committee unanimously resolved that Swami Biswanathananda will hereafter oversee all Deeksha ceremonies.

## Annual Report of the General Secretary For the financial year ended on 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2025

### INTRODUCTION

#### **With Reverence at the Lotus Feet of Shree Shree Ma Anandamayee**

The blissful Name of Shree Shree Ma Anandamayee—embodiment of the Supreme—continues to shower Her infinite grace upon all of humanity. With profound gratitude at Her Lotus Feet, we humbly present the Sangha's Annual Report, along with the Audited Accounts, for the year ending 31st March, 2025. May Ma's boundless blessings flow abundantly to all devotees, members, and well-wishers of the Sangha.

The sacred purpose of the Sangha is to draw inspiration from Shree Shree Ma Anandamayee and to engage in all activities guided by Her divine will—for the spiritual upliftment of mankind. In Her spirit of compassionate service, the Sangha also strives to promote relief to the poor, education, medical care, and other initiatives of public welfare, always upholding the principle of selfless action, free from profit motives.

#### **Ma has lovingly says:**

“Service purifies the mind; it brings bliss and happiness. Try to serve all beings as manifestations of God. He who can spend twenty-four hours of the day with God is on the path of great service to all beings. His works are worth emulation.”

In this spirit, the Sangha carries out its multifaceted service activities through its Headquarters at Kankhal, twenty-four Branch Ashrams across India, and two Associate Branches in Bangladesh. The principal activities of the Sangha include:

#### **Celebrations of Devotion and Joy Across the Ashrams**

##### **1. Ma Anandamayee Maha-Avirbhav Mahotsav**

With immense joy and reverence, we share that Ma's Avirbhav Mahotsav was celebrated with great fervour and devotion at the Kankhal Ashram and across all Ashrams of Ma. All rituals—Puja, Path, Yagna, Bhog, and Prasad—were performed in strict adherence to our sacred *parampara*, upholding all *niyams*. This is the most cherished and significant day for Ma's devotees, observed with deep devotion and festivity in Ashrams and homes across India and abroad.

##### **2. Sanyam Saptah**

As in previous years, the sacred observance of Sanyam Saptah Mahavrat witnessed heartfelt participation. The week concluded with a morning Yagna and an all-night Naam-Japa (Kirtan). The Bhimpura Ashram also hosted the Saptah in early February, continuing its annual tradition.

### **3. Sarodiya Durga Puja**

Durga Puja was conducted at Kankhal Ashram in accordance with Ashramic traditions. Celebrations also took place at Agarpara, Kalkaji, Agartala, Vrindavan, Pune, and Ranchi, drawing large gatherings of devotees throughout the Puja days.

### **4. Kali Puja and Annakoot**

Following Durga Puja, Lakshmi Puja was devoutly observed, followed by Kali Puja and Annakoot celebrations with full ritualistic splendour across various Ashrams. At Kalkaji Ashram, Annakoot remains one of the most prominent festivals, drawing nearly a thousand devotees.

### **5. Nirvana Tithi Puja of Baba Bholanath**

The sacred Tithi Puja of Pujya Bholanathji was observed at Kankhal, Dehradun, Agarpara (Kolkata), Delhi, Varanasi, and other Ashrams. At Kankhal, 21 Sadhus were served with devotion. Puja was also conducted in local temples, and fruits were distributed in hospitals as per tradition. Sadhu Bhajans and Pujas were held in many Ashrams.

### **6. Sanyas Utsav of Shree 108 Swami Muktananda Giriji**

To commemorate the Sanyas Utsav of Shree 108 Swami Muktananda Giriji, Puja and Sadhu Bhandara were organized in all Ashrams of the Mother with deep reverence.

### **7. Nirvana Tithi of Shree 108 Swami Muktananda Giriji**

On Shravan Shukla Saptami, the Nirvana Tithi of Swami Muktananda Giriji was observed with Shodashopachar Puja and Sadhu Bhandara. Devotees offered Pushpanjali at the Lotus Feet of Shree Shree Ma and Shree Giriji. Sadhu Bhandaras were held in all Ashrams.

### **8. Gita Jayanti**

Gita Jayanti was celebrated in nearly all Ashrams of Shree Shree Ma. Devotees recited six chapters of the Bhagavad Gita over the first three days, culminating in the full recitation on the fourth day, followed by a Yagna.

### **9. Ramnavami Utsav**

Shree Ram's Janma Puja was celebrated with Bhajan-Kirtans, Arati, and Prasad in most Ashrams, in keeping with our sacred traditions.

### **10. Hanuman Jayanti**

Observed in most Ashrams from 6:30 AM to 9:00 AM, Hanuman Jayanti was marked by the collective recitation of Hanuman Chalisa 108 times by devotees. This was followed by Puja, Kirtan, Arati, and distribution of Prasad.

### **11. Guru Purnima**

A deeply revered occasion for all devotees, Guru Purnima was celebrated in accordance with Ashram *parampara* across all centres. Ma's Special Puja was performed, accompanied by Bhajan, Kirtan, Satsang, Bhog Arati, and Pushpanjali. Mahaprasad was lovingly served to all.

### **12. Radha Krishna Jhulan Utsav**

Jhulan Manch was beautifully decorated in all Ashrams, where Puja, Arati, and Kirtan were

performed, followed by Prasad distribution. The Vrindavan Ashram's Anand Chalia temple hosted the celebration on a grand scale.

### **13. Janmashtami**

Shree Krishna Janmashtami was joyously celebrated in all Ashrams with devotional gatherings and soulful Bhajan-Kirtans. Special programs were organized at the Vrindavan and Varanasi Ashrams.

### **14. Ganesh Chaturthi**

Special Puja for Lord Ganesh was conducted in nearly all Ashrams, with Bhajan, Kirtan, and Satsang offered by devotees. The celebrations concluded with Arati, Pushpanjali, and Prasad.

### **15. Radha Ashtami**

Radha Janmashtami Puja was held from 10:00 AM to 1:00 PM, featuring Bhajan, Kirtan, Satsang, and Sharashopachar Puja for Shree Radhaji, followed by Arati, Pushpanjali, and Prasad.

### **16. Saraswati Puja**

Maha Saraswati Puja was celebrated with heartfelt devotion, especially by younger devotees seeking blessings from the Goddess of Learning. Special Bhajan, Kirtan, and Pushpanjali were performed, with large numbers of devotees in attendance.

### **17. Maha Shivratri**

The sacred Four Prahar Puja of Lord Shiva was performed throughout the night in most Ashrams, accompanied by Bhajan, Kirtan, Stotram, and ritual worship of Lord Shiva.

### **18. Holi Utsav**

From sunrise to sunset, Akhanda Naam Sankirtan was held in honour of Gouranga Mahaprabhu. Special Puja and Arati were performed, and Mahaprasad was distributed to all devotees.

## **UPDATES ON MAJOR ACTIVITIES IN VARIOUS ASHRAMS:**

### **Progress of AJP repairs**

As is known the Shapoorji Pallonji group had graciously offered to undertake the repair work of our AJP temple which included removal of all the marble on the outside surface of the structure, replastering, waterproofing and fresh marble laying a few years back. The work started in Feb/Mar 2023. The water proofing work got completed in March/April 2025, well before the monsoon and has withstood one of the heaviest monsoons in several decades recorded this year without any noticeable seepage or leakage. The work progress has been slow due to some genuine difficulties of the Shapoorji group as well as stoppages which had to be observed during several of our own festivals such as Janmotsav, Durga puja Sanyam etc. Due to the heavy monsoons even in Rajasthan areas the mines from where Marble were to be procured were flooded for several months due to which there was considerable delay in getting the marble .

However now the marble has arrived at site and the relaying work of Marble has been going on in full swing. It is expected that the entire work may get completed in next 2/3 months.

## AJP Temple Repairs Progress

- **Repair Scope:** Shapoorji Pallonji Group undertook extensive repairs including marble removal, replastering, waterproofing, and relaying.
- **Milestone Achieved:** Waterproofing completed by April 2025, successfully withstood this year's record monsoon.
- **Delays & Challenges:** Progress slowed due to festival-related pauses and marble procurement delays caused by flooding in Rajasthan mines.
- **Current Status:** Marble has arrived; relaying is underway. Completion expected within 2–3 months.

### **Shree Shree Ma Anandamayee Vidyapeeth, Kankhal**

- **Introduction:** The Vidyapeeth was founded in May 1941 under the guidance of Maa Anandamayee. It has moved several times and is currently located near the Samadhi Temple in Kankhal, Haridwar. It is recognized by the Uttarakhand Board of Secondary Education up to the junior high school level. The curriculum includes general education, devotional music, yoga, and prayer, along with co-curricular activities and sports.

- **Daily Routine:** The students' daily routine follows the Ashram and Gurukul system. It includes waking up early for yoga, pranayama, and meditation, followed by morning prayers at the Samadhi Temple. Classes run from 9:00 AM to 2:30 PM, following the curriculum set by the Uttarakhand government. The day also includes physical activities, evening prayers, and self-study.

- **Admission Process:** The admission process is determined by the Vidyapeeth's management committee. Admission for classes 9 to 12 is subject to the availability of seats. The academic session runs from July 1 to May 20.

- **Study and Teaching:**

At the Vidyapeeth, along with subjects prescribed by the Uttarakhand Government curriculum, students are also taught Computer Science, Art, Moral Education, and the study of the Vedas.

- **Annual Programs:**

Throughout the year, several programs are organized, including Guru Purnima, Raksha Bandhan, Independence Day, Teachers' Day, Gandhi Jayanti, Children's Day, and Gita Jayanti.

- **Annual Competitions:**

During the academic session 2025–26, various competitions will be held from August to February, such as essay writing, speeches, debates, rangoli, sports, Gita recitation, poetry, calligraphy, and yogasana.

- **Examinations:**

For student evaluation, three main examinations are conducted annually:

- Quarterly (1st September), Half-Yearly (8th December), Annual (9th March)

Additionally, monthly tests are held every month.

### **Ma Anandamayee Vidyapeeth, Agartala**

- **Introduction :** The school is affiliated with CBSE up to the secondary level. The 14th batch of 28 students all passed the secondary school examination, with the highest scores being 95%, 93%, and 92.8%. The school is making an effort to upgrade to the Higher Secondary Level by opening Class XI in 2025-26.

- **Infrastructure:** The school has 5 laboratories and a library with 4,214 books. Construction of a new school building on a 6.01-acre site at Lembuchera started in 2017-2018.

- **Students and Staff:** The student enrollment grew from 323 to 378 during the year. The school

has 27 teachers and 4 ayas. Staff are paid at the minimum wage rate as per a High Court order.

▪ **Activities:** The school offers sports, games, yoga, educational excursions, fine arts, and other extracurricular activities.

### **Ma Anandamayee Varanasi Kanyapeeth**

- **Institutional Legacy:** Founded in September 1938 under Shree Ma's direct Kheyal, Kanyapeeth continues to uphold the Gurukul tradition, offering residential Brahmacharya training to young Brahmcharini girls.
- **Academic Affiliations:** Affiliated with Sampurnanand Sanskrit University for Shastri and Acharya exams since 1969, and recognized by U.P. Sanskrit Madhyamik Shiksha Board since 2001.

- The **Goshala** was expanded to lovingly shelter **13 cows**, and the **riverbank ghat** was renovated with the graceful addition of **Matri Kripa Toron**.

Agarpara Ashram vibrates with continuous religious observances rooted in Ma's divine parampara, including:

- The **ancient glory** of the Ashram has been lovingly revived through the renovation of **Ma's room**, **Matri Mandir**, and **Shiv Temple**, and the installation of **Ma's marble murti**, radiating peace and devotion.
- For the offering of **Bhog Prasadam**, a **Goshala** was established, now home to **two cows and one calf**, cared for with reverence and love.

## 10. Puri Ashram

### Swargadwar, Puri 752001, Odisha

On moonlit nights, devotees recall Ma's swan-like gait, Her radiant white form gliding along the shore, Her smile outshining hundreds of moons, and the melodious chanting of God's name by Chhabi Banerjee echoing through the waves.

### Divine Moments & Sacred History

- The revered Vaishnava saint **Shree Shamadas Baba**, residing near Haridas Math, longed to see Ma but was unable to travel due to ill health. In a divine gesture, **Ma Herself came to Puri**, fulfilling his heart's desire.
- Here, devotees were blessed to offer **Mahaprasada** directly into Ma's sacred mouth—a moment of profound grace.
- Many felt fulfilled witnessing both the **movable Jagannath (Sachal)** and the **immovable Jagannath (Achal)** in Ma's presence, merging the seen and unseen divinity.
- Even today, the **sound of Kirtan** seems to rise from the ocean waves, enveloping the Ashram in a ceaseless rhythm of devotion.

### Establishment & Renovation

- The Ashram was established in **March 1939**, with construction beginning in **1940**.
- In recent years, **Agarpara Ashram's management**, along with new committee members, have lovingly supported the Ashram's **renovation, puja arrangements**, and spiritual activities—both physically and financially.
- In **2019**, **Ma's room** and **Didima's room** were thoroughly renovated. A **main gate** was constructed, and the **courtyard was enclosed with steel wire netting** to protect from monkeys. The space is now **aesthetically adorned with plants**, creating a serene and devotional atmosphere.

### Spiritual Celebrations & Parampara

The Ashram continues to uphold Ma's divine traditions through:

- Daily **puja of Maa, Sadhu and Brahmachari Seva**, and observance of sacred festivals like **Jhulan Purnima** and **Namyagna Mahotsav**
- The **Annual Jhulan Purnima** celebration includes **evening Namyagna Mahotsav**, where the air resonates with divine chanting and collective devotion

1. **Accommodation** is available for devotees and Brahmacharins, especially those seeking **Shree Jagannath darshan**, at the Ashram's guest house.
2. The Ashram is blessed with the presence of **Swami Golakananda Maharaj**, who guides seekers with wisdom and compassion.
3. Spiritual and cultural guidance is offered to all, transcending barriers of caste, color, or creed.
4. The **Publication Counter** shares Ma-inspired books and materials for the upliftment of humanity.

5. **Clothing and blanket distribution** is lovingly conducted before Durga Puja and during winter, serving those in need.
6. **Daridra Narayan Seva** is performed periodically, honoring the divine presence in every soul.

### **Ma Anandamayee Gaushala, Kankhal**

**Inauguration & Facilities:** A modern Gaushala was inaugurated on August 10, featuring advanced systems for gobar disposal, gaumutra collection, hygienic cow care, milk processing, and a serene green campus.

- **Cow Care:** Home to ~30 desi cows (Gir, Sahiwal), fed with nutrient-rich fodder and green grass. Medical care is provided as needed.
- **Milk Distribution:** Supplies ~20 litres of A2 milk daily to the Ashram, with additional quantities for festivals. Some milk is sold to Ashramites and visitors to support operations.
- **Recordkeeping:** A transparent system tracks daily milk production and distribution.
- **Celebrations:** Gobardhan Puja, Havan, and free Mattha distribution were joyfully conducted.
- **Recognition:** Esteemed Gaushala members from Haridwar and Rishikesh praised the cleanliness and spiritual ambiance.
